

Quick facts

- *Campanula glomerata* has dense clusters of bell-shaped flowers, typically in shades of blue to purple
- *Campanula glomerata* is commonly known as clustered bellflower



Upon Arrival

- Open all boxes and bags immediately upon receipt
- Let the bare roots thaw out slowly
- Check the condition of the roots in the boxes
- If you notice any damage, please contact your sales rep within 7 days



Pot size

- Recommended pot size: Ø 17 cm; 1 bare root per pot



Planting

- Best time for planting is early spring.
- Check the bareroots before planting and discard any soft ones
- Best temperature to start cultivation: 35-55 F / 2-12 °C
- Use well-drained, medium-moist soil
- Firm the soil around the roots to prevent air pockets
- This genus has to be planted with the crown just below soil level and prefers priority planting



Watering

- After first time watering, wait until the plants emerge before watering again
- Keep the soil consistently moist, especially during dry periods. Water at the soil level to avoid wetting the foliage, which can help prevent fungal diseases



Ongoing care

- Once established, *Campanula* requires no special attention
- Apply a balanced fertilizer particularly in the spring and summer



Prevention and protection

- *Campanula glomerata* is relatively resistant to pests and diseases, but keep an eye out for slugs and aphids. Use appropriate pest control methods if necessary
