Quick facts

- Easy to grow
- Early spring planting
- Sales: late spring, summer and autumn
- Different types of flowers every season
- Amazing range of shrubs available
- Yearly pruning to keep in shape



Upon Arrival

- Open all boxes and bags immediately upon receipt
- Let the shrubs thaw out slowly
- Check the condition of the shrubs in the boxes
- If you notice any damage, please contact your sales rep within 7 days



Planting

- Best time for planting is (early) spring
- Use a well-drained soil
- Most shrubs we offer you can plant in a 17-20 cm container
- Planting a shrub is quick and easy, but worth doing carefully to ensure your plant settles in well
- Best temperature to start cultivation: 60-68F / 15-20C°
- Start fertilizing after the root system is well developed



Watering

- First watering after planting
- Shrubs in containers need regular watering over the summer



Ongoing care

- Use your grower skills to closely monitor the growing
- Shrubs in containers need fertilizing from spring until late summer
- Removing spent flowers encourages further flowers, but is not essential and often not practical on large shrubs



Pruning

- Pruning can keep shrubs healthy, productive and attractive, as well as keep these compact.
- Don't get worried about pruning; Shoots that are growing in unwanted directions can also be pruned out



Prevention and protection

- Shrubs are usually very robust garden plants and if grown in conditions that suit their needs, they should be relatively trouble-free
- Positioning the shrub too deep in the soil can lead to stem rotting and shrub failure
- Poorly drained or waterlogged soil could kill your shrubs
- Remove and dispose of all leaf debris at the end of the year

Cornus (Common Dogwood)
'Anny's Winter Orange'
sanguinea

- Medium-sized deciduous shrub
- Intensely coloured winter stems



Cornus (Tatarian Dogwood)
'Elegantissima' alba

- Rich, red coloured stems
- Pale-green foliage with striking, silver-white variegation



Cornus (Tatarian Dogwood)
'Nightfall' alba

- Particularly noted for its impressive autumn display
- During winter, the plant reveals its slender red stems



Cornus (Tatarian Dogwood)
'Midwinter Fire' sanguinea

- Bright orange-yellow stems at the base and red at the tips
- White flower clusters



Cornus (Tatarian Dogwood)
'Miracle' alba

- Red stems bearing ovate to elliptic foliage
- Grey-green leaves with creamy-white margins



Cornus (Tatarian Dogwood)
'Sibirica' alba

- A rapid-growing, multi-stemmed shrub
- Brilliant red stems in winter



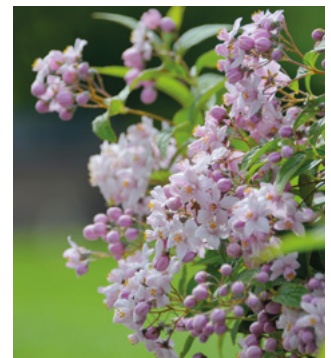
Corylus (Hazel)
'Red Majestic' avellana

- Plant habit compact and outward spreading
- Leaves a rich, dark burgundy in spring and summer



Corylus (Hazel)
'Contorta' avellana

- Twisted and spiralling branches, twigs and leaves
- Grows to multi-stemmed tree



Deutzia (Deutzia)
'Mont Rose' hybrid

- Bearing slender, dark green leaves
- Dense clusters of star-shaped, rose pink flowers



Diervilla (Bush honeysuckle)
'Magical Firefly' *sessilifolia x splendens*

- A stunning mix of gold, orange, and red foliage
- Heat tolerant and low maintenance



Diervilla (Bush honeysuckle)
'Magical Starry Night' *sessilifolia x splendens*

- Dark purple to black leaves
- Bright yellow flowers
- Attracts pollinators



Forsythia (Golden Bell)
'Goldraush' *intermedia*

- Compact variety
- Bright golden-yellow flowers



Deutzia (Deutzia)
'Raspberry Sundae' *hybrid*

- Compact shrub
- Ideal for growing in pots and flower borders



Deutzia (Deutzia)
'Strawberry Fields' *hybrid*

- Late spring and early summer colours
- Pretty clusters of pink and white star-shaped flowers



Hibiscus (Rose Mallow)
'Flower Tower Purple' *syriacus*

- Narrow, ascending, columnar growth habit
- Vibrant purple, half-filled flowers with red hearts



Hibiscus (Rose Mallow)
'Flower Tower Ruby' *syriacus*

- Narrow, ascending, columnar growth habit
- Beautiful dark pink-red, half-filled flowers with red hearts



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Candlelight' *paniculata*

- Conical flower heads are borne strongly upright
- Deep red stems



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Diamant Rouge' *paniculata*

- New panicle hydrangea
- Unusual colour and dramatic impact



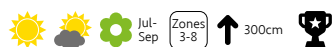
Hibiscus (Rose Mallow)
'Flower Tower White' *syriacus*

- Narrow, ascending, columnar growth habit
- Great white, half-filled flowers



Hydrangea (Tree Hydrangea)
'Annabelle' *arborescens*

- The large flowers start from soft green and turn into pure white



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Groundbreaker Blush'
paniculata

- First groundcover panicle hydrangea
- Gold medal at Green Retail Awards



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Fraise Melba' *paniculata*

- Impressive conical blooms emerge ivory
- Deep strawberry pink autumn colour



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Hercules' *paniculata*

- Upright hydrangea with strong thick shoots
- Huge spectacular cone-shaped flowers



Hydrangea (Rough-leaf Hydrangea)
'Hot Chocolate' *aspera*

- Felted mid-green leaves tinged with purple when young
- Small pink flowers



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Limelight' *paniculata*

- Cone-shaped panicles of mostly sterile flowers
- Flower colour changes as they mature



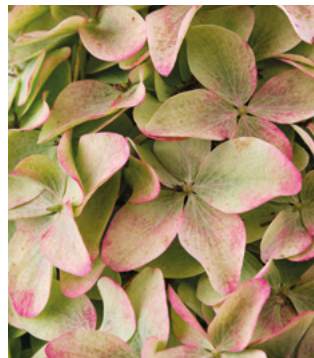
Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Little Fresco' *paniculata*

- Small deciduous shrub, large panicles of cream white flowers
- Light green flowers in summer turning to pink



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Little Spooky' *paniculata*

- Beautiful dwarf variety
- Full, round flower panicles with white flowers



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Magical Candle' *paniculata*

- Large conical panicles of lime green flowers



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Magical Lime Sparkle' *paniculata*

- Unusual shade of green
- Changes to green with hints of pink flowers



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Magical Matterhorn' *paniculata*

- White-green plumes across the entire plant



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Magical Mont Blanc' *paniculata*

- Large, dense, conical panicles
- Fragrant bright green flowers



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Magical Summer' *paniculata*

- Very large flowers
- Strong stems



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Mojito' *paniculata*

- Lime-green cone-shaped flowers
- Flowers turn to a gorgeous shade of pale pink



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Pastelgreen' *paniculata*

- Upright deciduous shrub with oval green leaves turning red in autumn



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Petite Cherry' *paniculata*

- Compact growing hydrangea that flowers profusely
- Early flowering



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Petite Flori' *paniculata*

- Compact, well-branched shrub
- Early flowering
- Flowers emerge lime-green and fade to pink and dark red



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Petite Star' *paniculata*

- Compact shrub
- Starts to flower lime-green and turns white, pink then finally red



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Pink & Rose' *paniculata*

- Similar to vanilla fraise but has sturdier stems
- Sturdy branches of big flowers



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Phantom' *paniculata*

- Enormous white flower panicles
- Flowers pale green in early summer and fade to white



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Pink Diamond' *paniculata*

- Dense, pyramidal, cone-shaped panicles of sterile and fertile flowers
- Red-stemmed branches



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Pink Lady' *paniculata*

- Bold conical white flowers at the ends of the branches
- The flowers are excellent for cutting



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Polar Bear' *paniculata*

- Dense, conical flower heads of lime green
- Flowers turn to a dusky shade of pink in autumn



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Silver Dollar' *paniculata*

- The flowers emerge white in July, gradually take on a pink flush
- Continue blooming into the fall



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Skyfall' *paniculata*

- Green buds open to reveal crisp white blooms
- Flowers flushed with pink as they mature



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Sundae Fraise' *paniculata*

- Compact growth with small white flowers turning to light pink



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Vanille Fraise' *paniculata*

- Loose pyramid-shaped clusters of flowers
- Flowers emerge creamy-white and turn shades of pink to red



Hydrangea (Panicle Hydrangea)
'Wims Red' *paniculata*

- Honey-scented blooms fade to pale pink in July
- Flowers turn to an attractive wine-red, lasting until November



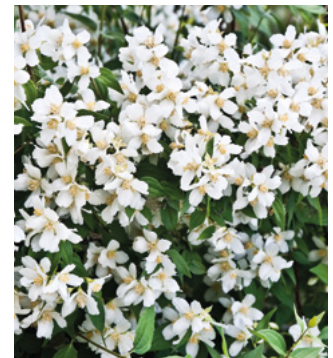
Kolkwitzia (Beautybush)
'Pink Cloud' *amabilis*

- Masses of small, deep pink, trumpet-like flowers



Philadelphus (Mock Orange)
'Belle Etoile' *spp.*

- Abundant, gorgeous, bridal-white flowers
- Oval, deep green leaves



Philadelphus (Mock Orange)
'Lemoinei' *spp.*

- Strong shrub, fragrant flowers
- The flower colour is white



Philadelphus (Mock Orange)
'Manteau d'Hermine' *spp.*

- A compact, award-winning shrub
- Much loved and highly fragrant variety



Philadelphus (Mock Orange)
'Minnesota Snowflake' *spp.*

- Profuse white flowers are double and very fragrant
- Blooms begin in late spring



Philadelphus (Mock Orange)
'Snowbelle' *spp.*

- Abundant bloom of fragrant, double white flowers



Philadelphus (Mock Orange)
'Virginal' *spp.*

- A large, vigorous, deciduous shrub
- Upright, bushy habit, ideal for the back of a border



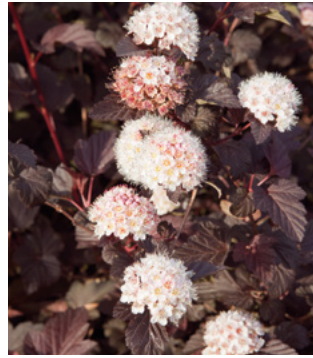
Physocarpus (Nine Bark)
'Darts Gold' opulifolius

- Compact medium-sized deciduous shrub
- Clusters of small, cream or pink-tinged flowers



Physocarpus (Nine Bark)
'Diable d'Or' (P) opulifolius

- Copper coloured young shoots in spring which turn into red/purple in summer



Physocarpus (Nine Bark)
'Lady in Red' opulifolius

- Red to red-purple leaves
- Clusters of small, cup-shaped, pale pink flowers



Physocarpus (Nine Bark)
'Magic Ball' opulifolius

- In summer the orange colour of the foliage turns into yellow, orange and red



Physocarpus (Nine Bark)
'Red Baron' opulifolius

- Leaves are a rich deep red, borne on red stems



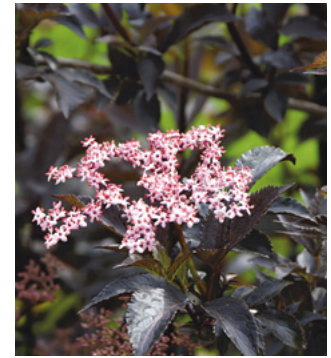
Ribes (Redflower Currant)
'King Edward VII' sanguineum

- Red coloured flowers, followed by black berries
- Mid green leaves lightly aromatic in scent



Ribes (Redflower Currant)
'Pulborough Scarlet' sanguineum

- Vigorous, medium-sized to large, deciduous shrub
- Dense, upright habit



Sambucus (Black Elder)
'Black Beauty' nigra

- Dark foliage with creamy-white flowers
- Red, white or black berries



Sambucus (Black Elder)
'Black Lace' nigra

- Intense purple black, finely cut lacy foliage
- Fragrant pink edible flowers



Sambucus (Black Elder)
'Black Tower' nigra

- The bush is covered in clusters of small pink flowers
- Large panicles



Sambucus (Black Elder)
'Golden Tower' nigra

- Narrow upright growth
- Showy, yellow-green foliage
- White flower clusters



Syringa (Common Lilac)
'Mme Lemoine' *vulgaris*

- Known for its profuse, fragrant, double white flowers
- Compact



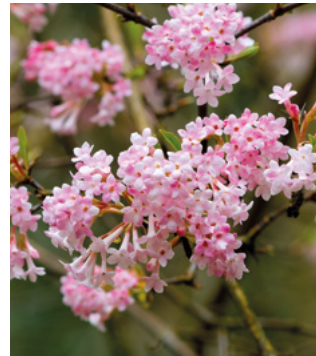
Viburnum (Snowball Tree)
'Charles Lamont' *bodnantense*

- Bare branches with tight clusters of bright pink blooms
- Highly fragrant blooms



Viburnum (Snowball Tree)
'Compactum' *opulus*

- Compact habit
- Lace cap-type white flowers in spring



Viburnum (Snowball Tree)
'Dawn' *bodnantense*

- Winter-flowering shrub
- Densely packed clusters of rose, pink or bluish white flowers
- Sweetly scented blooms



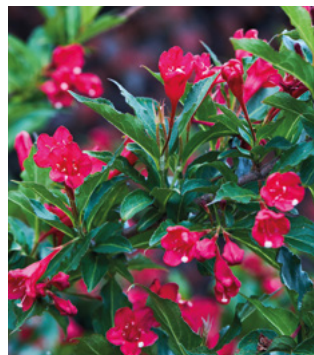
Viburnum (Snowball Tree)
'Roseum' *opulus*

- Branches covered with large, snowball-like clusters of white or green-tinted white flowers



Weigela (Bush Honeysuckle)
'Alexandra' *florida*

- Dark burgundy red foliage
- Creates a small mound of unusual colour



Weigela (Bush Honeysuckle)
'Red Prince' *hybrid*

- Non-fading intense reddish hue of flowers



Weigela (Bush Honeysuckle)
'Variegata' *florida*

- One of the best weigelas
- More compact than the species
- Rose-pink blooms



Weigela (Bush Honeysuckle)
'Wings of Fire' *florida*

- Leaves, mid-green in spring
- Red-flushed in summer
- Turning bright red in autumn
